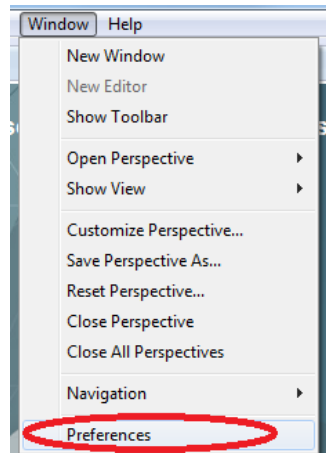


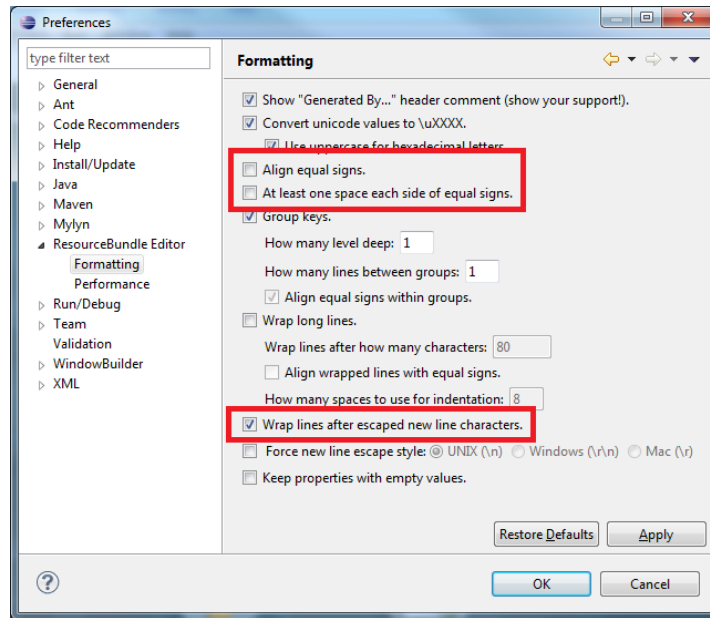
1. Download and Install Eclipse IDE for Java Developers
 - a. Go to <http://www.eclipse.org/downloads/>
 - b. Select Windows 32 Bit



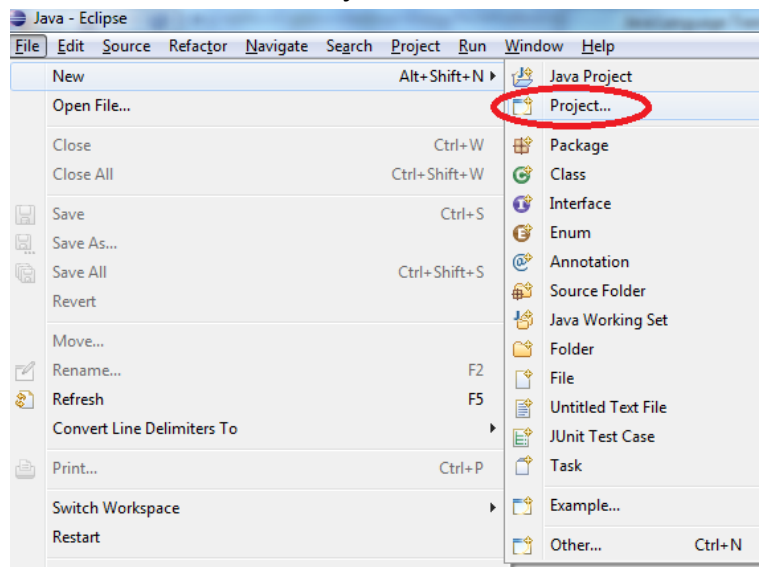
- c. Extract the downloaded file to a directory (Ex. D:\Eclipse)
2. Download Eclipse ResourceBundle Editor Plug-in
 - a. Download the plug-in at <http://sourceforge.net/projects/eclipse-rbe/files/latest/download?source=files>
 - b. Extract the downloaded file to Eclipse directory (Ex. D:\Eclipse)
 - c. In Eclipse directory (Ex. D:\Eclipse), open eclipse.exe
 3. Configure Eclipse ResourceBundle Editor
 - a. After opening eclipse. Click **Window menu > Preferences**



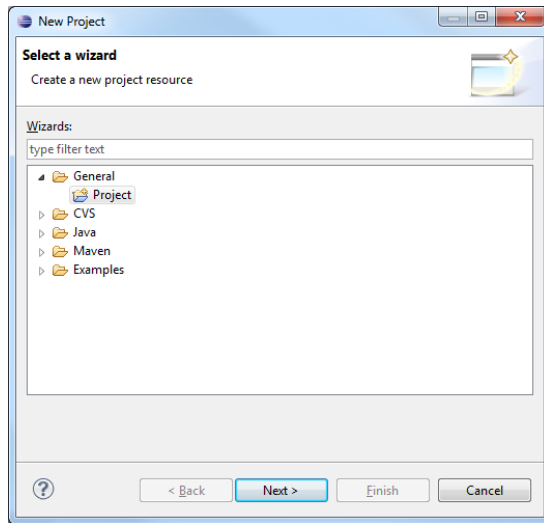
- b. Navigate to **ResourceBundle Editor > Formatting**. And make sure the following are checked/unchecked.



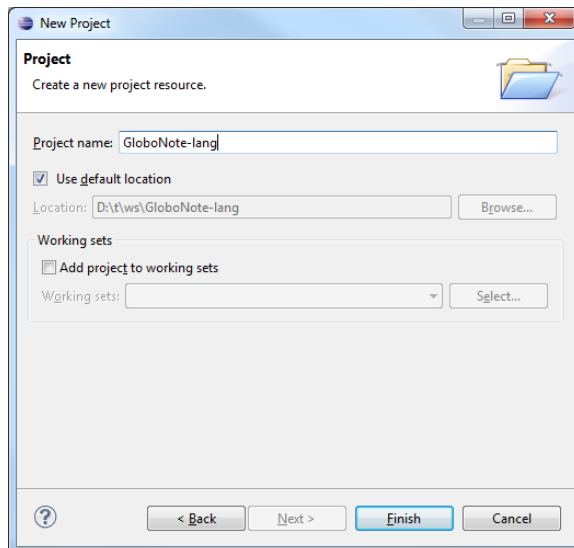
- c. Click OK to close the window
4. Opening language files
 - a. **Close** the Welcome screen of Eclipse
 - b. Click **File menu > New > Project...**



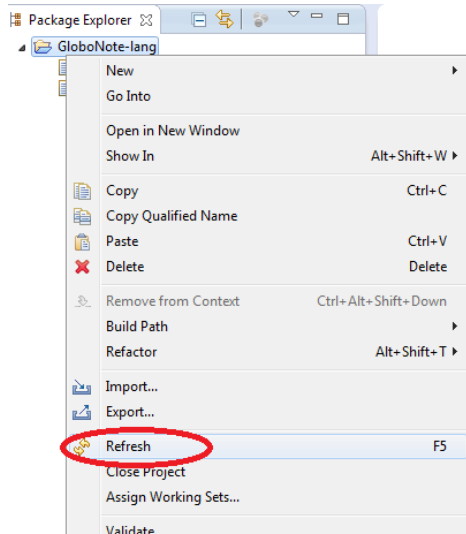
- c. New Project window will be displayed. Select **General > Project** then click **Next**.



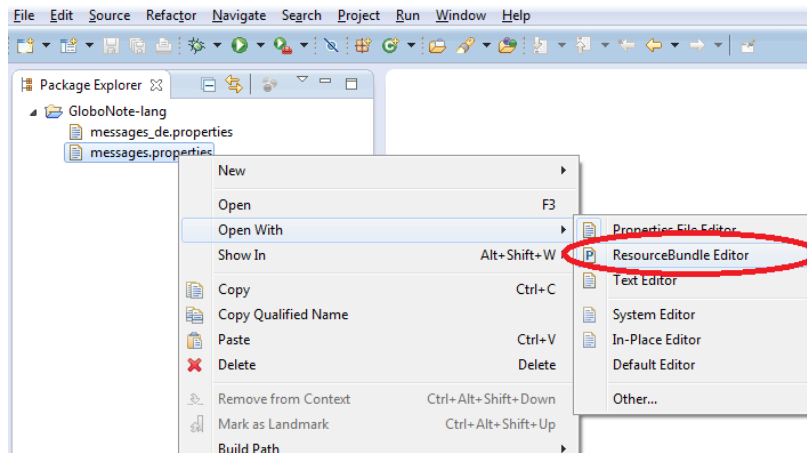
- d. Enter a project name (Ex. GloboNote-lang) then click **Finish**.



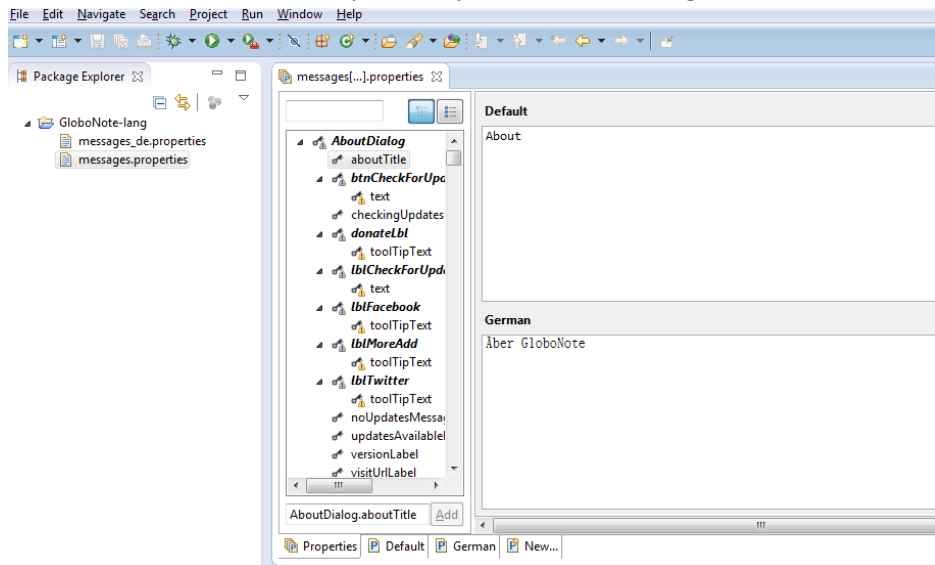
- e. Empty project will be created.
- f. In File manager/Windows Explorer, copy the messages.properties and the language file to be translated (Ex. messages_de.properties) to the directory where the project is located (Ex. D:\t\ws\GloboNote-lang)
- g. After copying the file, in eclipse, right click on the project (Ex. GloboNote-lang) then click **Refresh**



- h. List of properties files will be displayed below the project folder. Right click on messages.properties file, select **Open With > ResourceBundle Editor**



- i. ResourceBundle editor will open and you can start editing.



- j. To create new language file, click **New...** and select the **Locale**
